**Title:** Yuba City Boat Ramp Sediment Removal Project

**Applicant:** Sutter Butte Flood Control Agency (SBFCA)

**Location:** Sovereign land in the Feather River and the confluence of the Feather and Yuba Rivers, adjacent to Assessor's Parcel Numbers 52-570-006, 010-260-017, 010-020-010, 010-020-011, and 010-020-015, near Yuba City, Sutter and Yuba counties

**Description:** The Proposed Project would include the following: maintenance dredging of the boat ramp/boat area and the confluence of the Feather River and the Yuba River; dewatering the dredged material in the existing northernmost wastewater ponds at the former Marysville Wastewater Treatment Plant (WWTP) proposed by the City of Marysville for decommissioning; and disposal of the dredged material. Phase 1 of the Project would involve removal of the originally planned 65,600 cy, and Phase 2 of the Project would involve the additional 250,000 cy if additional funding becomes available, for a total of 315,600 cy. The State Lands Commission action is approval of a 5-year General Lease – Dredging Use through April 27, 2031.

This is to advise that the California State Lands Commission as Lead Agency Responsible Agency, approved the above-described project on February 9, 2026, and made the following determinations regarding the project.

- 1) The project will will not have a significant effect on the environment.
- 2) An Environmental Impact Report (EIR) was prepared pursuant to the provisions of CEQA.
- 3) Mitigation measures were were not made a condition of the approval of the project.
- 4) A mitigation reporting or monitoring plan was was not adopted for this project.
- 5) A Statement of Overriding Considerations was was not adopted for this project.

6) Findings were were not made pursuant to the provisions of CEQA.

The lead agency for the project, SBFCA, certified the EIR and Mitigation Monitoring and Reporting Program (MMRP) and approved the project on February 10, 2021. The California State Lands Commission has previously considered the EIR as prepared for this project by the SBFCA and adopted an independent Mitigation Monitoring Program incorporating SBFCA's document, which remains in full force. The EIR and the record of project approval may be examined at the California State Lands Commission office address.



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
