

The City of Orange is preparing an Initial Study/Mitigated Negative Declaration for the Main Street Medical Office Building (project) located in Orange, Orange County, California. The proposed project is subject to the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) and, therefore, must comply with California Public Resources Code thus must comply with California Public Resources Code § 21080.3.1 (Assembly Bill [AB] 52 of 2014), which requires local governments to conduct meaningful consultation with California Native American tribes that have requested to be notified about projects in the geographic area with which the tribe is traditionally and culturally affiliated.

The project site, which is rectangular in shape, is located at 331/353/393 South Main Street, at the northeast corner of the intersection of W. Culver Avenue/Stewart Drive and S. Main Street. Please see the attached Figure 1 for a project location map. The project proposes the construction and operation of a four-story medical office building adjacent to the existing St. Joseph Hospital campus, and a subterranean parking garage containing up to five levels of parking. Construction would include the demolition of the existing motel and medical office structures on the project site, vegetation and parking lot removal, excavation, grading, placement of new concrete foundations, building construction, and the installation of landscaping, irrigation, lighting, storm drain facilities, and underground utilities. The maximum anticipated ground disturbance for the project will be 63 feet deep for the subterranean parking structure.

A record search for the proposed project has been requested from the South Central Coastal Information Center of the California Historical Resources Information System at California State University, Fullerton. 




Project Location Map Conceptual Project Plans


