Good afternoon,

My name is Greg Kapovich and I am the Waterfront and Economic Development Director for the City of Redondo Beach. I have been working closely with Sean Scully, who is the Planning Manager for the City on this project (cc'd here). I've also included members of

our environmental consultant team, Matt Gonzalez, Marco Mendoza, and Danielle Griffin.

I'd like to take this time to clarify that the proposed project includes an amendment to our municipal code only. It does not include any construction and certainly no ground disturbances. The scope includes amending our zoning code to adjust the amount of parking stalls required for new restaurant and office uses. Additionally, we are creating new language that allows future developers to explore creative means to meet minimum parking requirements. Ideas include shared parking, valet parking, mechanical lifts, etc. These revised standards would apply to any future construction projects and any business wishing to locate within an existing tenant space. CEQA evaluation of those future construction projects would be reviewed for each individual project as plans are submitted for construction and you will be given the opportunity to review those projects for ground disturbances (and other CEQA matters) on a case-by-case basis. However, for now, we're only adjusting the zoning code applicable to future construction projects.

Please let me know if you have any follow-up questions or concerns but I can say for certain that the proposed text amendments will not result in any ground disturbances.
