Project Description (Proposed actions, location, and/or consequences).

The applicant requests a Discretionary Tree Permit and Major Modification to Conditional Use Permit No. 1776 to authorize (1) expansion of facilities at an existing summer camp; (2) an increase in camp population by 100 daytime and overnight guests; (3) an increase in the frequency, attendance, and duration of events; and (4) establishment and operation of the water system for the Brandeis-Bardin Mutual Water Company. Expanded camp facilities would include a welcome center, 13 camper cabins, 3 counselor cabins, an arts pavilion, and a parking lot.

Mitigation measures have been provided to reduce the following potentially significant effects to less than significant: 1) Biological Resources (special status wildlife, sensitive plant communities, wetlands, wildlife connectivity, and protected trees); 2) Geology and Soils (paleontological resources); 3) Hazards (emergency response and evacuation); 4) Public Services (fire protection facilities); 5) Tribal Cultural Resources (unanticipated subterranean resources); and 6) Wildfire (emergency response and evacuation, and exacerbation of wildfire risk).
