CEQA Guidelines Section 15123 suggests that an EIR include a summary of "areas of controversy known to the Lead Agency" and "[i]ssues to be resolved." Based on public comments and input received to date, areas of interest that are related to potential adverse physical environmental effects consist of:

- tribal cultural resources impacts and Native American Tribal consultation;
- use of VMT to identify transportation impacts per Senate Bill 743;
- transportation impacts and mitigation measures that require the Judicial Council to pay a fare share of the cost for necessary improvements and consider implementing a Transportation Demand Management Program to reduce VMT and GHG emissions;
- incorporating multi-modal transportation improvements as part of the project; and
- hydrology and construction-related impacts.

Provide a list of the responsible or trustee agencies for the project.

The following agencies could be required to act as responsible agencies for the proposed Project:

- Office of the State Fire Marshal - approvals to construct and occupy;
- San Francisco Bay Regional Water Quality Control Board - Clean Water Act (CWA) and National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) General Construction Permit/Stormwater Pollution Prevention Plan (SWPPP);
- City of Sunnyvale Department of Public Works, Engineering Division - encroachment permits, if required;
- City of Sunnyvale Department of Public Works, Engineering Division - water supply and sewer connection; wastewater discharge permit; and
- City of Sunnyvale Public Safety Department - fire department review of emergency access and fire flow.
