



# NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARINGS AND NOTICE OF AVAILABILITY OF THE SACOG DRAFT MTP/SCS, AND THE ASSOCIATED DRAFT ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT REPORT, AMENDMENT TO THE MTIP, AND AIR QUALITY CONFORMITY ANALYSIS

- **Draft 2025 Metropolitan Transportation Plan/Sustainable Community Strategy (MTP/SCS)**, also known as 2025 Blueprint – The Draft 2025 Blueprint covers the area within the counties of Sacramento, Yolo, Yuba, Sutter, Placer and El Dorado (excluding the Lake Tahoe basin). The Draft 2025 Blueprint, prepared in coordination with cities, counties, and other public agencies in the SACOG region, is a long-range transportation plan and sustainable communities strategy to serve existing and projected residents and workers through the year 2050. The Draft 2025 Blueprint accommodates growth in the region, including approximately 580,000 residents, 260,000 jobs, and 278,000 homes, with a transportation investment strategy of \$40.9 billion. SACOG is required under federal and state law to update the MTP/SCS every four years.
- **Draft Environmental Impact Report (EIR) on the Draft 2025 Blueprint (MTP/SCS)** – The Draft EIR examines the potential for environmental impact from implementation of the 2025 Blueprint. The Draft EIR identifies significant effects in the following areas: aesthetics; agriculture and forestry resources; air quality; biological resources; cultural resources; geology, soils, and paleontological resources; greenhouse gas emissions and energy; hazards and hazardous materials; noise and vibration; public services; recreation; transportation; tribal cultural resources; utilities and service systems; and wildfire.
- **Draft Amendment #11 to the 2025-28 Metropolitan Transportation Improvement Program (MTIP) and Draft Air Quality Conformity Analysis, associated with the proposed MTP/SCS**– The MTIP is the short-range transportation program for the SACOG region, which includes the counties of Sacramento, Sutter, Yolo, Yuba, and portions of El Dorado and Placer County. The MTP/SCS is the long-range transportation plan for the SACOG region. The Air Quality Conformity Analysis is a determination of compliance with air quality standards for both the MTIP and MTP/SCS.

The California Environmental Quality Act requires this notice to disclose whether any listed toxic sites are present at the project site. Some areas within the Draft MTP/SCS are contained on the lists compiled pursuant to California Government Code sections 65962.5(a)(4) and (c)(1-3). Since this is a regional, programmatic Draft EIR, subsequent project-level environmental documents will be required to disclose the presence of toxic sites for the individual projects.
