#### **BACKGROUND:**

The Applicant was issued Temporary Approval by DCR with an effective date of April 11, 2023. Since that time, the Applicant has adhered to the requirements of the Los Angeles Municipal Code (LAMC) and DCR's Rules and Regulations, and completed all requirements for the issuance of an Annual License. The Applicant currently possesses a State Provisional License, CCL19-0005639, to conduct Cultivation, Indoor Small (Type 2A), active June 17, 2025.

The Applicant is not subject to the requirements of LAMC Section 104.20 for the Social Equity Program. The Business Premises is located at 5717 S Towne Avenue, Los Angeles, CA 90011, a parcel zoned for Limited Industrial purposes.

#### **DEPARTMENT ANNUAL LICENSING DETERMINATIONS:**

DCR recommends approving the Annual License for the Applicant based on the following factors:

- The Applicant has met the Application requirements under LAMC Section 104.03.
- The Business Premises location meets the requirements under LAMC Section 105.02.
- The Application does not contain any grounds for denial under LAMC Section 104.04.
- (Social Equity only): The Applicant has met the requirements under LAMC Section 104.20.

#### THERE ARE NO EXISTING REASONS TO DENY AN ANNUAL LICENSE:

DCR or the Cannabis Regulation Commission may deny an Annual Application for the reasons stated in LAMC section 104.04. These denial reasons include, but are not limited, to:

- The Business Premises is substantially different from the diagram of the Business Premises submitted by the Applicant or Licensee;
- Denying DCR employees or agents access to the Business Premises;
- Procuring a License by fraud or deceit, making a material misrepresentation, false statement, or knowingly failing to disclose a material fact;
- Failing to timely to provide DCR with requested information, forms or documents;
- Denial of a license, permit or other authorization to engage in Commercial Cannabis Activity by any state or other local licensing authority;
- Creation a significant public safety problem as documented by a law enforcement agency;
- Failure to adhere to the requirements of this article or the Rules and Regulations;
- Engaging in unlicensed Commercial Cannabis Activity in violation of Section 104.15;
- (Social Equity Only) Failing to comply with any requirement in LAMC Section 104.20;
- The Business Premises was the site of a utility disconnect, padlocking or certain criminal convictions for a period of 5 years from the date of the conviction, padlock or disconnect;
- Improper zoning or distancing of the Business Premises from Sensitive Uses under LAMC Section 105.00 et seq; and,
- An Owner is an individual who holds office in, is employed by, any agency of the State of California and any of its political subdivisions when the individual's duties include the enforcement or regulation of Commercial Cannabis Activity or any other penal provisions of law of the State of California prohibiting or regulating Commercial Cannabis Activity.

At present, DCR is not aware of any existing facts or circumstances to deny this Annual License for the reasons in LAMC Section 104.04.

#### CALIFORNIA ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY ACT (CEQA) PROJECT DESCRIPTION:

**Elise Management** (Applicant) is seeking an annual license for a Cultivation License for a 30,525 square foot cultivation facility, which currently operates under Elise Management. The applicant was previously granted provisional state licensing for cultivation on the project site in 2019. The proposed project is located on a site zoned for Limited Industrial (M1-2D-CPIO) at 5717 S Towne Avenue, Los Angeles CA 90011 (Assessor's Parcel Number 5101-008-001). The Project-Specific Information (LIC-4013-FORM) submitted by the Applicant states that no construction is required at the project site, and that the existing structure, a 30,525 square foot cultivation facility, will remain and no expansion is proposed. The City of Los Angeles Department of Water and Power currently provides water, sewer and electricity to the project site.

The continued operation consists of a cannabis cultivation facility that would operate 7 days a week from 8:00 am to 10:00 pm and would consist of six employees per shift. The project would not involve construction or modifications to the existing building. The proposed project is projected to require three deliveries to the site weekly, and six vehicle trips per day. Aerial images confirm that the parking area is sufficient to accommodate employees, and loading/unloading activities.

Pre-application review found the project to be consistent with the Land Use and Zoning Designations of the project site. Further project site information is provided in the Project Parcel report from the City's Zone Information and Map Access System (ZIMAS) (Exhibit B). Compliance with Los Angeles Municipal Code Sections 104.00 *et seq.* and 105.00 *et seq.*, as well as DCR's Rules and Regulations, does not waive or otherwise circumvent any other City or State requirements or necessary permits from the City, State, or other public agencies, such as the Los Angeles Department of Building and Safety, the Los Angeles Fire Department, or the Los Angeles County Public Health Department. Full compliance with all applicable regulations for the proposed cannabis use(s) are assumed in this analysis.

#### **CEQA PROJECT ANALYSIS & FINDINGS:**

#### **Land Use/Zoning Designations**

Limited Industrial / M1-2D-CPIO

#### **Surrounding Land Use/Zoning Designations**

Limited Industrial / M1-2D-CPIO Low Medium I Residential / R2-1-CPIO Public Facilities / PF-1

#### **Subject Property**

The proposed project is located in an existing one-story cultivation facility within an industrial and residential area in Los Angeles, specifically the Southeast Los Angeles Community Plan Area and Council District 9. The project site has a Limited Industrial Land Use Designation and is zoned M1-2D-CPIO. The project site is approximately 46,086 square feet with the lease area being 127 feet deep, and 41 feet wide along Towne Avenue and 58<sup>th</sup> Street on a flat plane. The building is currently operating as a cannabis cultivation facility under Elise Management and no new development or improvements are proposed.

## **Abutting Properties**

Abutting uses include multi-family residential, Towne Avenue and 58<sup>th</sup> Street, and heavy manufacturing within 200 feet of the site. The immediate area along Towne Avenue is predominantly developed with Low Medium I Density Residential, R2-1-CPIO, and Limited Industrial, M1-2D-CPIO. On the south edge of the project site is 58<sup>th</sup> Street, which is surrounded by Limited Industrial, M1-2D-CPIO.

#### **CEQA Findings**

CEQA Guidelines, Sections 15301 and 15332, Class 1 and Class 32, consists of projects characterized as in-fill development meeting the following 5 conditions: (a) The project is consistent with the applicable general plan designation and all applicable General Plan policies as well as with the applicable Zoning Designation and regulations; (b) The proposed development occurs within city limits on a project site of no more than five acres substantially surrounded by urban uses; (c) The project site has no value as habitat for endangered, rare or threatened species; (d) Approval of the project would not result in any significant effects relating to traffic, noise, air quality, or water quality; and (e) The site can be adequately served by all required utilities and public services. These conditions are met as follows:

- a) The proposed project is consistent with the applicable General Plan Designation and all applicable General Plan policies as well as with the applicable Zoning Designation and regulations for the requested commercial cannabis activities. The site is comprised of one lot totaling 46,086 gross square feet, zoned as M1-2D-CPIO, with a one-story building originally constructed in 1941. No relief has been requested from any applicable provision or requirement of the Los Angeles Municipal Code.
- b) The project site is wholly within the City of Los Angeles, on an approximately 46,086 gross square foot property (i.e., less than five acres), and is substantially surrounded by urban uses. The surrounding area is zoned Two-Family, Limited Industrial, and Public Facilities. The types of land uses and businesses in the area include multi-family residential, parking, road infrastructure, and manufacturing facilities.
- c) The project is located within an established, fully developed neighborhood, with no known habitats or ecologically valuable areas, including riparian or riverine habitats. Additionally, the project does not propose construction and would therefore not require the removal of any trees on-site and/or within the adjacent right-of-way, and would not conflict with the Migratory Bird Treaty Act. Therefore, the project site has no value as habitat for endangered, rare, or threatened species.
- d) The proposed project would not change its current operations in its current location as no expansion of the existing cannabis distribution facility is proposed. Therefore, approval of the proposed project would not result in any significant effects relating to traffic, noise, air quality, or water quality.
- e) The project site is adequately served by all required public utilities and services, given that the site is currently served by the City's Department of Water and Power, the City's Bureau of Sanitation, the Southern California (SoCal) Gas Company, the Los Angeles Police Department, the Los Angeles Fire Department, Los Angeles Unified School District, Los Angeles Public Library, and other public services. Compliance with Regulatory Compliance Measures as enforced through the Department of Building and Safety permitting process will ensure that any improvements needed would be made in order to provide adequate delivery of utilities and services to the proposed project.

CEQA Section 15300.2: Exceptions to the Use of Categorical Exemptions. The City has further considered whether the proposed project is subject to any of the exceptions set forth in State CEQA Guidelines Section 15300.2, that would prohibit the use and reliance on the categorical exemptions. None of the exceptions are triggered. As the proposed project will result in no physical changes to the site, the project would not have physical impacts to the environment. As such, it would not have a combined impact with other projects in the area that would result in cumulative impacts. There are no unusual circumstances associated with the project, which is proposed in General Plan Designation (Limited Industrial) and Zoning classification (M1-2D-CPIO) that allow the proposed use. The proposed project will not physically change the site or the existing structures. Therefore, the project would have no impact on scenic resources, historic building(s), and the site is not on the lists that

satisfy Government Code Section 65962.5, commonly referred to as the "Cortese List," as being affected by hazardous wastes or clean-up problems.

Based on the analysis above, the proposed project is consistent with the criteria for Class 1 and Class 32 categorical exemptions (tit. 14, Cal. Code Regs., §§ 15301 and 15332) and does not require further analysis based on the exceptions in CEQA Guidelines Section 15300.2, and thus, DCR finds that no further CEQA analysis is required.

In conclusion, since the proposed project meets all of the requirements for categorical exemption as set forth at CEQA Guidelines, Sections 15301 and 15332, and none of the applicable exceptions to the use of an exemption apply to the proposed project, it is appropriate to determine this project is categorically exempt from the requirements of CEQA.

The Department of Cannabis Regulation:
