San Bernardino County Dept. of Public Works CFA 16 (Mountain Disposal Services, Inc.): Located primarily within the mountainous regions of San Bernardino County, including areas served by Mountain Disposal Services. The area encompasses communities in the San Bernardino National Forest, including Summit Valley. encompasses communities in the San Bernardino National Forest, including Summit Valley. CFA 17 (Big Bear Disposal, Inc.): Situated within the San Bernardino Mountains, primarily covering the Big Bear Lake region and surrounding unincorporated areas. The area excludes portions lying within the City of Big Bear Lake and the Big Bear Community Service District. CFA 21 (USA Waste of California, Inc.): Encompasses unincorporated areas in the southwestem part of San Bernardino County, serving residential, commercial, and industrial areas not covered by municipal waste collection services.

Project Description: The San Bernardino County's Solid Waste Handling Franchise Agreements (Agreements) were initially adopted by the Board of Supervisors (Board) on May 19, 1998 (Item No. 57) to provide affordable solid waste handling services that protect the health and safety of the community while establishing waste reduction and recycling programs 825 E.
