

Hazards and Hazardous Materials, cont'd: Emit hazardous emissions or involve handling hazardous or acutely hazardous materials, substances, or waste within one-quarter mile of an existing or proposed school; Impair implementation of or physically interfere with an adopted emergency response plan or emergency evacuation plan. Applicable Mitigation: MM HAZ-1: Implement Hazardous Materials Spill Prevention and Containment Measures; MM HAZ-2: Implement Recommendations from the Phase II Environmental Site Assessment; MM TR-1: Develop and Implement a Construction Traffic Management Plan.

Hydrology and Water Quality: Violate any water quality standards, waste discharge requirements (WDRs), or otherwise substantially degrade water quality; Conflict with or obstruct implementation of a water quality control plan or sustainable groundwater management plan. Applicable Mitigation: MM HAZ-1: Implement Hazardous Materials Spill Prevention and Containment Measures; MM HAZ-2: Implement Recommendations from the Phase II Environmental Site Assessment.

Noise: Generation of a substantial temporary or permanent increase in ambient noise levels in the vicinity of the project in excess of standards established in the local general plan or noise ordinance, or applicable standards of other agencies; Generation of excessive groundborne vibration or groundborne noise levels. Applicable Mitigation: MM NOI-1: Implement Construction Noise Reduction Measures; MM NOI-2: Minimize Construction Noise Vibration.

Public Services: Result in adverse physical impacts associated with the provision of new or physically altered governmental facilities or a need for new or physically altered governmental facilities (police protection). Applicable Mitigation: MM TR-1: Develop and Implement a Construction Traffic Management Plan.

Transportation: Conflict with applicable circulation plans, ordinances, or policies and applicable congestion management programs; Inadequate emergency access. Applicable Mitigation: MM TR-1: Develop and Implement a Construction Traffic Management Plan.

Tribal Cultural Resources: Cause a substantial adverse change in the significance of a tribal cultural resource, defined in Public Resources Code section 21074 as either a site, feature, place, cultural landscape that is geographically defined in terms of the size and scope of the landscape, sacred place, or object with cultural value to a California Native American tribe, and that is:

- i. Listed or eligible for listing in the California Register of Historical Resources, or in a local register of historical resources as defined in Public Resources Code section 5020.1(k)
- ii. A resource determined by the lead agency, in its discretion and supported by substantial evidence, to be significant pursuant to criteria set forth in subdivision (c) of Public Resources Code Section 5024.1. In applying the criteria set forth in subdivision (c) of Public Resource Code Section 5024.1, the lead agency shall consider the significance of the resource to a California Native American tribe.

Applicable Mitigation: MM CR-1: Provide Cultural Resources Sensitivity Training and Monitoring; MM CR-2: Prepare and Implement an Archaeological and Tribal Cultural Resources Treatment Plan; MM CR-3: Implement Response Protocol for the Unanticipated Discovery of Human Remains; MM TCR-1: Prepare a Burial Treatment Plan.

Wildfire: Substantially impair an adopted emergency response plan or emergency evacuation plan.

Applicable Mitigation: MM TR-1: Develop and Implement a Construction Traffic Management Plan.
