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Project Title: Permit No. 19971 - Moms Farm Ag Building, Car Port, and Solar Panels Project

Project Applicant: Moms Farm

Project Location: The project is located approximately two miles northeast of the intersection of the Butte/Glenn/Colusa County lines, approximately two miles to the nearest levee of the right (west) bank of Cherokee Canal, and within Area E of the Butte Basin about three miles north of the Gridley Road, at 39.40561°N 121.86173°W, Butte Basin, Butte County.

Project Description: To install a new 50-foot by 44-foot agricultural storage building, a 24-foot by 52-foot carport with a 24-foot by 52-foot roof mounted solar array, and a 95-foot by 93-foot solar panel field. Additionally, 375 cubic yards of fill will be placed to construct an earthen pad. The maximum depth of excavation will be for the conduit associated with the solar panels, with a depth of 2.5 feet.

Reasons Why Project is Exempt:

The project is exempt from CEQA under the Class 3, New Construction or Conversion of Small Structures categorical exemption (CEQA California Code of Regulations, Title 14, Section 15303), because the activity consists of construction and location of limited numbers of new, small facilities or structures, and the installation of small new equipment and facilities in small structures. The project is also exempt from CEQA under the Class 4, Minor Alterations to Land categorical exemption (CEQA California Code of Regulations, Title 14, Section 15304), because the activity consists of minor private alterations in the condition of land and vegetation which do not involve removal of healthy, mature, scenic trees except for agricultural purposes. Further, none of the exceptions to the exemption in CEQA California Code of Regulations, Title 14, Section 15300.2 apply.
