PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The California Department of Forestry and Fire Protection (CAL FIRE) San Luis Obispo (SLU) is proposing to lease approximately 8,546 sf of office space within an existing building located at 100 Cross Street in San Luis Obispo. REASONS PROJECT IS EXEMPT

This project fits under Class 1, Section 15301, Existing Facilities. Class 1 projects consist of the operation, repair, maintenance, permitting, *leasing*, licensing, or minor alteration of existing public or private structures, facilities, mechanical equipment, or topographical features, involving negligible or no expansion of existing or former use. The project consists of entering into a new lease for office space within an existing building.

Field review by CAL FIRE staff confirmed that no exceptions apply that would preclude the use of a notice of exemption for this project.
