Caltrans proposes to rehabilitate 19 drainage systems and remediate fish passage at two of those locations on U.S. Highway 101 between Post Miles M0.0 and 46.5 in Del Norte County. The purpose of this project is to (1) rehabilitate existing drainage systems to a state of good condition and (2) to remediate barriers to fish passage.

The project would have a less than significant impact on the following CEQA topics: Biological Resources, Greenhouse Gas Emissions, Hazards and Hazardous Materials, and Hydrology and Water Quality.
