Project Description (Proposed actions, location, and/or consequences).

Westervelt Habitat Restoration, also known as Hamilton Bend (PD-25-7), proposes a General Plan Amendment and Rezone to change the land use designation of approximately 226 acre property from River Frontage (R-F) and Exclusive Agriculture (E-A) to Resource Management (R-M). The project involves the creation of 205.08 acres of compensatory mitigation habitat credits that will restore and preserve riverine and floodplain riparian habitats, including habitat for salmonids, green sturgeon, and Valley Elderberry Longhorn Beetle (VELB). Specifically, the proposed project includes a 60-acre VELB habitat planting area (which includes 39 acres that would be planted and preserved and 21 acres that would be preserved), a 107-acre riverine riparian planting area, and a 36-acre floodplain riparian planting area within the project site.
The project is located at 4075 River Road in Colusa County, approximately 3.5 miles north of the City of Colusa (APNs 012-270-043 & -058, and 015-030-001). It is located west of River Road and is bound by the Sacramento River to the west and south.
