Project Description (Proposed actions, location, and/or consequences).

To maintain levee integrity and provide long-term flood protection to Egbert Tract, Reclamation District No. 536 is planning to repair approximately 2,050 linear feet of the landside levee along the right bank of the Lindsey Slough Levee (Unit 1). Site preparation activities will include stripping, clearing, and grubbing upland vegetation within the construction footprint. Prior to fill placement, a portion of the existing landside levee embankment will be excavated by cutting 25 ft laterally from the existing levee toe to remove and recompact the historical levee fill material composed of poorly compacted low-quality fill materials. The levee embankment will then be reconstructed to a finish grade of 4:1 by placing and compacting a mix of stockpiled and imported levee fill materials. The levee crest access road will be reconstructed by compacting aggregate base materials to restore it to its pre-project condition. Disturbed areas on the landside levee slope will be hydroseeded with native grasses after construction.

Mitigation measures included for the Project to avoid or minimize potential environmental impacts are included in the attached Initial Study, which is hereby incorporated and fully made part of this Mitigated Negative Declaration. Implementation of these mitigation measures will ensure that the potential environmental impacts of the Project are less than significant. Mitigation is included to reduce potentially significant impacts to less-than-significant levels for biological resources, cultural resources, and tribal cultural resources. Reclamation District No. 536 has agreed to implement each of the identified mitigation measures, which will be adopted as part of the Mitigation Monitoring and Reporting Program.
