Project Design Features for the Geotechnical Investigation for the Bayside Community Resiliency Project

1. All geotechnical boring and CPT-related activities will occur during the work week (Monday-Friday) during normal work hours.
2. Any and all multi-use path and/or trail closures will be notified by signage onsite at least 1 week in advance and detour information will be provided. Pathways will be open on weekends and weekday mornings and evenings.
3. All geotechnical boring and CPT-related activities will occur outside of the avian nesting season.
4. All geotechnical boring and CPT-related activities will avoid sensitive habitat, including special-status plants as surveyed and identified in the "Bore Site Rare Plant Survey Results" (November 2024), prepared by Fred Roberts
5. All geotechnical boring and CPT-related activities will avoid sensitive cultural and tribal cultural resources as documented in the "Archaeological Resources Management Report for the Bayside Community Resiliency: The Living Levee Project and Geotechnical Field Investigation, San Diego County, California" (March 2025), prepared by ASM Affiliates.
