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Project Title: Enforcement No. 2025-15716 – Notice to Proceed with Compliance Plan and Schedule for Removal of Access Ramp

Project Applicant: Austin Edwards

Project Location: The restoration work is located within Reclamation District 501 (RD0501) on the right bank of the Steamboat Slough, Unit 1, at 3902 East Ryer Road, Walnut Grove, CA 95690, from approximately LM 1.87 to 1.90, in Solano County.

Project Description: To approve a Compliance Plan for Enforcement Case No. 2025-15716. Implementation of the Plan will result in removal of the unauthorized waterside access ramp between the levee and the subject property. Work includes: (1) remove approximately 100 to 150 cubic yards of fill placed on the waterside levee slope, and (2) restore the levee to preexisting conditions.

Reasons Why Project is Exempt:

The project is exempt from CEQA under the Class 21, Enforcement Actions by Regulatory Agencies categorical exemption (CEQA California Code of Regulations, Title 14, Section 15321), because the activity consists of actions taken to enforce or revoke a lease, permit, license, certificate, or other entitlement for the issues, adopted, or prescribed by the regulatory agency or enforcement of law, general rule, standard, or objective, administered or adopted by the regulatory agency. In addition, The project is exempt from CEQA under the Class 4, Minor Alterations to Land categorical exemption (CEQA California Code of Regulations, Title 14, Section 15304), because the activity consists of minor public or private alterations in the condition of land, water, and/or vegetation which do not involve removal of healthy, mature, scenic trees except for forestry or agricultural purposes. Finally, the project is exempt from CEQA under the Class 1, Existing Facilities categorical exemption (CEQA California Code of Regulations, Title 14, Section 15301), because the activity consists of the demolition and removal of accessory structures. Further, none of the exceptions to the exemption in CEQA California Code of Regulations, Title 14, Section 15300.2 apply.
