Project Description (Proposed actions, location, and/or consequences).

The Department of Resources Recycling and Recovery (CalRecycle) proposes implementing the CalRecycle Rotelli Burn Dump Remediation Project (Project). CalRecycle has been designated as Lead Agency under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA). The project is proceeding according to the Burn Dump Protocol in coordination with the Department of Toxic Substances Control (DTSC) and the Regional Water Quality Control Board (CVRWQCB), who are providing regulatory oversight. The Project is intended to reduce the potential for environmental and public health and safety risks associated with unstable slopes and exposed burn waste at the closed Rotelli Burn Dump (Dump) in unincorporated Tuolumne County. This would be accomplished by excavating and consolidating waste and then covering the area with soil and revegetating the area.

Identify the project's significant or potentially significant effects and briefly describe any proposed mitigation measures that would reduce or avoid that effect.

- Mitigation Measure BIO-1 would reduce general potentially significant remediation impacts to protect wildlife species and their habitats to less than significant.
- Mitigation Measure BIO-2 would reduce potentially significant impacts on special status plants to less than significant by requiring protocol-level field surveys to identify populations of special-status plant species within the site prior to the initiation of any remediation activities.
- Mitigation Measure BIO-3 would prevent impacts to, or mortality of individual special-status amphibians or reptiles by requiring a qualified biologist implement standard USFWS mitigation and avoidance measures.
- Mitigation Measure BIO-4 would reduce impacts on migratory birds to less than significant by requiring a qualified biologist to survey nesting birds no more than 3 days prior to the beginning of tree and vegetation removal or ground disturbing activities and take appropriate actions as relevant.
- Mitigation Measure BIO-5 would reduce impacts on special-status bats to less than significant by requiring that a qualified biologist survey the Project Area and vicinity for bats and any foraging or roosting habitat and take appropriate actions as relevant.
- Mitigation Measure BIO-6 would reduce impacts on aquatic resources to less than significant by requiring that CalRecycle obtain a U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) Section 404 CWA permit (Nationwide Permit 38 Cleanup of Hazardous and Toxic Waste), Central Valley Regional Water Quality Control Board (CVRWQCB) Section 401 Water Quality Certification, and CDFW Section 1602 Lake and Streambed Alteration Agreement for impacts to waters of the U.S. and State, and that they comply with all mitigation measures and requirements established in these permits.
