Project Title: Gladstone Park Shade Structure and Picnic Installation

Project Location: Gladstone Park: 600 E. Gladstone Street, Glendora CA.

Project Description: The proposed project includes minor improvements to an existing city park. The scope includes the excavation and removal of approximately 2,000 square feet of existing turf and soil, the pouring of a concrete pad (approximately 2,000 square feet), and installation of a fabric shade structure and several fixed concrete picnic tables. The project is designed to enhance public usability of the park and provide shaded seating for visitors. No trees will be removed and all work will be conducted within previously disturbed, developed park land.

Surrounding Land Uses and Setting: **Gladstone Park is a public park** Gladstone Park is a public city park located in a developed urban neighborhood in Glendora, California. Surrounding land uses include various residential zones consisting primarily of single-family homes and an adjacent fire department station to the east.

The Community Development Director recommends the following exempt status / findings:

Reasons why project is exempt: The project involves minor improvements to an existing public park facility. The work consists of installing small new structures such as a shade canopy and concrete tables (Class 3), and minor grading and land alteration involving less than 2,500 square feet of surface area (Class 4). The project will not impact sensitive resources, will not result in cumulative environmental effects, and is not located on a hazardous waste site, historic resource, or scenic highway. Therefore, the project does not trigger any exceptions listed under CEQA Guidelines §15300.2.
