Project Description (Proposed actions, location, and/or consequences).

To authorize an 11,000 square-foot sanctuary building, a 5,000 square-foot children's ministry center, a 7,700 square-foot youth recreation center and multipurpose building with a new baptismal area, two (2) sport court facilities, an outdoor barbecue area, and a total of 213 parking stalls located on the existing Calvary Chapel campus (Project) currently developed with five (5) portable trailers and a 3,300 square-foot sanctuary building located at 1780 Orchard Heights Avenue in Beaumont, CA 92223.

Identify the project's significant or potentially significant effects and briefly describe any proposed mitigation measures that would reduce or avoid that effect.

Based on the analysis contained in the Initial Study/ Mitigated Negative Declaration, the proposed project would not result in any significant and unavoidable environmental impacts. The project could result in potentially significant impacts related to biological resources (including nesting birds), cultural resources, tribal cultural resources, paleontological resources, and temporary construction noise. However, implementation of identified mitigation measures — including pre-construction biological surveys and avoidance buffers, archaeological and tribal monitoring during ground-disturbing activities, stop-work procedures for inadvertent discoveries, paleontological monitoring in sensitive geologic units, and adherence to construction noise standards and time restrictions — would reduce all impacts to a less-than-significant level. With incorporation of these mitigation measures and standard conditions of approval, the project qualifies for adoption of a Mitigated Negative Declaration pursuant to CEQA.
