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Project Title: Enforcement No. Case No. 2025-15711 Notice to Comply with Compliance Plan and Schedule for Natomas Cross Canal Pole

Project Location: The work is located within Reclamation District 1001 on the landside shoulder of the Natomas Cross Canal levee, at approximately 38.815760°N, 121.555445°W, levee mile 3.6, in Sutter County.

Project Description: To approve the Plan for Enforcement Case No. 2025-15711. Implementation of the Plan includes removing the power pole and non-compliant gravel backfill from the levee, then reinstalling the pole using a flowable Controlled Low Strength Material (CLSM) for compliant backfilling around the pole.

Public Agency Approving Project: Central Valley Flood Protection Board (Board)

Exempt Status:

Categorical Exemption: Sections 15321 Enforcement Actions by Regulatory Agencies, 15304 Minor Alterations to Land, and 15301 Existing Facilities

Reasons Why Project is Exempt:

The project is exempt from CEQA under the Class 21, Enforcement Actions by Regulatory Agencies categorical exemption (CEQA California Code of Regulations, Title 14, Section 15321), because the activity consists of actions taken to enforce or revoke a lease, permit, license, certificate, or other entitlement for the issues, adopted, or prescribed by the regulatory agency or enforcement of law, general rule, standard, or objective, administered or adopted by the regulatory agency. In addition, The project is exempt from CEQA under the Class 4, Minor Alterations to Land categorical exemption (CEQA California Code of Regulations, Title 14, Section 15304), because the activity consists of minor public or private alterations in the condition of land, water, and/or vegetation which do not involve removal of healthy, mature, scenic trees except for forestry or agricultural purposes. Finally, the project is exempt from CEQA under the Class 1, Existing Facilities categorical exemption (CEQA California Code of Regulations, Title 14, Section 15301), because the activity consists of the demolition and removal of accessory structures. Further, none of the exceptions to the exemption in CEQA California Code of Regulations, Title 14, Section 15300.2 apply.
