Project Name: Right of Entry Permit for California Department of Transportation at Julian Museum and Pioneer County Park

Project Description: The project consists of right of entry permit for the California Department of Transportation to access County property for replacing the existing sidewalk and curb ramp that does not meet ADA compliance with an ADA compliant sidewalk and curb ramp over about two hundred and ten (210) square feet of County owned property. A section of the ramp as well as the tie-in to existing sidewalk are in the County parcel. The permit term begins upon commencement of work, but not before February 15, 2027, and expires three weeks after the commencement date or February 28, 2029, whichever is earlier.

This is to advise that the County of San Diego Department of General Services has approved the above-described project on February 26, 2026, and found the project to be exempt from the CEQA under the following criteria:

Statement of reasons why project is exempt:

This right of entry permit is categorically exempt from CEQA pursuant to Section 15301, Existing Facilities as it involves permitting access to County land for alterations to an existing sidewalk and curb ramp that involves no expansion of the existing or former use. The permit is categorically exempt from CEQA pursuant to Section 15302, Replacement or Reconstruction because it involves replacing an existing sidewalk and curb ramp to comply with ADA. Further, no exceptions listed in CEQA Guidelines Section 15300.2 apply to the project. Additionally, the project will not impact environmental resources of hazardous or critical concern that are designated, precisely mapped and officially adopted by government agencies; does not contribute to cumulative environmental impact; will not have a significant impact on the environment due to unusual circumstances; does not damage scenic resources within a designated state scenic highway; and is not on the list of Hazardous Waste and Substance Sites pursuant to Section 65962.5 of the Government Code.

This Notice of Exemption has been signed and filed by the County of San Diego.

This notice must be filed with the Recorder/County Clerk as soon as possible after project approval by the decision-making body. The Recorder/County Clerk must post this notice within 24 hours of receipt and for a period of not less than 30 days. At the termination of the posting period, the Recorder/County Clerk must return this notice to the Department address listed above along with evidence of the posting period. The originating Department must then retain the returned notice for a period of not less than twelve months. Reference: CEQA Guidelines Section 15062.
