Project Description (Proposed actions, location, and/or consequences).

The Mariposa County Public Works Department (County) proposes road widening and associated improvements along Fournier Road. Proposed improvements along Fournier Road would span the entire length of the roadway and would include widening the roadway to two 12-foot travel lanes. The proposed project also includes new pavements, construction of a sidewalk, curb and gutter, detention basin, a bridge, on-street parking adjacent to the cemetery, and striping at the intersection with Antone Road. The proposed project would also include grading, right-of-way dedication, and relocation of utilities. The project site is not part of a site that is included on the State Cortese List (Government Code Section 65962.5[a]).

The proposed project would address potentially significant impacts related to the conversion of forest lands to non-forest use through MM BIO-1.

The proposed project would address potentially significant impacts related special-status species, riparian habitats and other sensitive communities, migratory fish or other wildlife species, and policies protecting biological resources through implementation of MM BIO-1 through MM BIO-6.

The proposed project would address potentially significant impacts related to cultural and tribal cultural resources through implementation of MM CUL-1 through MM CUL-3.

The proposed project would address potentially significant impacts related to paleontological resources through MM GEO-1.

The proposed project would address potentially significant impacts related to the release of hazardous materials through implementation of MM HAZ-1a through MM HAZ-1c.

The proposed project would address potentially significant impacts related to surface and groundwater through MM BIO-5 and those related to erosion and flooding through MM BIO-1.

The proposed project would address potentially significant impacts related to emergency access through MM TRANS-1.

The proposed project would address potentially significant impacts related to an emergency response or evacuation plan in the event of a wildfire through MM TRANS-1.
