Description of Nature, Purpose and Beneficiaries of Project:

This project is located at El Dorado Beach (APN 026-050-006) in South Lake Tahoe, CA. The Project proposes temporary beach stabilization to bury exposed supersack sandbags, address an existing public safety concern, stabilize shoreline conditions, and reduce erosion and sediment mobilization into Lake Tahoe. The work will involve placement of up to 60 cubic yards of clean, compatible sand both landward and below the ordinary high-water mark. Temporary BMPs will be installed. A long term solution will be pursued in a future phase.

Reasons why project is exempt:

The proposed project is Categorical Exempt from CEQA under Section 15307, Class 7, which consists of actions taken to maintain, restore, or enhance a natural resource and Section 15304 Class 4, which consists of minor alterations in the condition of land, water, and/or vegetation which does not involve the removal of mature trees. The sand placement will stabilize the shoreline at El Dorado Beach and prevent further erosion, as well as the prevent or reduce the discharge of sediment and microplastics resulting from the exposure and degradation of super sack sandbags, thereby protecting water quality in Lake Tahoe.
