

**NOTICE OF AVAILABILITY**  
**ENVIRONMENTAL ASSESSMENT AND FONSI**  
**FOR THE FOUR CORNERS FEE-TO-TRUST PROJECT**

**PIT RIVER TRIBE**  
**SHASTA COUNTY, CALIFORNIA**

Notice is hereby given that the Bureau of Indian Affairs (BIA), Pacific Region (PR), has reviewed the Environmental Assessment (EA) prepared for the Pit River Tribe, Four Corners Fee-To-Trust application to place approximately 40.24 acres of land into federal trust. The Tribe seeks this acquisition to support future economic development, including the construction of a truck stop, restaurant, hotel, commercial spaces, RV park, and parking lot. Such development is expected to create jobs, stimulate the local economy, and provide essential services to travelers. The project site is located within Section 35, Township 35 North, Range 3 East on the southeastern side of the Four Corners intersection of State Route 299 and 89 (SR-299 and SR-89), Shasta County, California. There are six (6) parcels identified with Assessor's Parcel Numbers (APNs). The Proposed Action and the No Action were evaluated in the EA.

Based on the analysis and impacts in the EA, any input received during this public review period, and the entire administrative record, the BIA, PR will decide whether to issue a signed Finding of No Significant Impact (FONSI), direct further work on the EA, or initiate the preparation of an Environmental Impact Statement (EIS). A draft, unsigned FONSI has been prepared and is available for review along with the EA.

The EA and draft, unsigned FONSI will be available for a 30-day review period from March 26, 2026, to April 25, 2026.
