Project Title: Muir Woods Road Improvement Project

Project Description (Proposed actions, location, and/or consequences).

The proposed improvements primarily consist of resurfacing, restoring, and rehabilitating the roadway. Improvements include replacing and realigning a substandard bridge over Redwood Creek; formalizing a segment of the Redwood Creek Trail along the roadway; stabilizing the roadway embankment in areas of slope failure; and implementing drainage improvements consisting of culvert repair, culvert replacement, and culvert outfall protection. The Proposed Project would also include signing and striping.

Identify the project's significant or potentially significant effects and briefly describe any proposed mitigation measures that would reduce or avoid that effect.

Replacing the bridge over Redwood Creek and realigning the road would require clearing and grubbing of trees and would therefore result in the loss of such forest land due to the conversion of forest land to non-forest use and could affect birds. With implementation of MM BIO-4 (removed trees will be replaced in accordance with permit requirements at a ratio determined in consultation with regulatory agencies), construction and operation of the Proposed Project would have a less than significant impact.

Aquatic habitat for coho salmon, longfin smelt, and steelhead (including designated critical habitat) may be directly affected. A mitigation plan will be developed for habitat impacts and approved by NMFS prior to construction.

Construction could cause direct effects to California Red-legged Frog (CRLF) and northwestern pond turtle (NPT). A mitigation and monitoring plan will be developed for CRLF and NPT habitat impacts and will be provided to the USFWS for review and approval prior to construction.
