Description of Nature, Purpose and Beneficiaries of Project:

Routine maintenance for the Major & Secondary Arterial Roadway involves the design and construction of infrastructure improvement such as sidewalks, curb, curb & gutters, driveways, alley entrances and bus pads and roadway resurfacing. The work generally includes constructing Portland cement concrete pavement, curbs, gutters, sidewalks, asphalt concrete pavement, crushed miscellaneous base, grading, concrete and bituminous surface removal. The work will also include adjusting or reconstructing manhole frames, reconstructing curb drains, reconstructing storm drain connector pipes, and the restoration of traffic striping and markings. No new bus pads are proposed and there will be no tree removal. All work is to be restoration of existing infrastructure.
