Project Description (Proposed actions, location, and/or consequences).

The Greater Vallejo Recreation District (GVRD) proposes to renovate and enhance Franklin Recreation Center Park, which consists of the former Franklin Middle School property. Proposed Park facilities would include an outdoor basketball court, pickleball courts, play area, a multiuse synthetic turf field, a multiuse natural turf field, and a concession/picnic area. In addition, the proposed project would result in the construction of related improvements to complement the new recreation areas, including parking, landscaping, lighting, utilities, and stormwater management.

Identify the project's significant or potentially significant effects and briefly describe any proposed mitigation measures that would reduce or avoid that effect.

Air Quality - Construction of the proposed project could result in fugitive dust, and toxic air contaminants. Mitigation includes implementation of Bay Area Air District Best Management Practices and use of Tier 4 equipment.

Biological Resources - Implementation of the proposed project could impact special-status wildlife species. Mitigation includes worker environmental awareness training, pre-construction surveys, and avoidance measures during construction.

Cultural Resources - Historical or archaeological resources could be discovered during ground disturbing activities. Mitigation includes worker awareness training, stopping work in the event of a discovery, consulting a qualified archaeologist, and implementing appropriate measures to evaluate, and protect the resource.

Paleontological Resources - Paleontological resources could be discovered during ground disturbing activities. Mitigation includes stopping work, consulting a qualified paleontologist and implementing appropriate measures.

Noise - Implementation of the proposed project could result in operational noise related to the proposed pickleball courts. Mitigation includes installation of a noise barrier to provide sufficient noise reduction.

Tribal Cultural Resources - Tribal cultural resources could be discovered during ground disturbing activities. Mitigation includes monitoring during ground disturbance, stopping work in the event of a discovery, and implementing appropriate measures in consultation with the Consulting Tribe(s).
