Title: American River Common Features, 2016 Flood Risk Management Project, Sacramento, California, American River Contract 3A (ARC3A) Project

Applicant: Central Valley Flood Protection Board

Location: Sovereign land in the American River, along the left bank of the Lower American River from River Mile (RM) 3.8 to 4.2, near Sacramento, Sacramento County

Description: The American River Contract 3A (ARC3A) Project includes the installation of approximately 3,000 linear feet of levee erosion protection to reduce the risk of levee erosion during high flow events on the Lower American River. The ARC3A Project also includes the installation of on-site riparian habitat features and instream woody material to provide on-site habitat for fish and wildlife species. The State Lands Commission action is approval of a 49-year General Lease – Public Agency Use through April 6, 2075.

This is to advise that the California State Lands Commission as Lead Agency Responsible Agency, approved the above-described project on April 7, 2026, and made the following determinations regarding the project.

- 1) The project will will not have a significant effect on the environment.
- 2) An Environmental Impact Report (EIR) was prepared pursuant to the provisions of CEQA.
- 3) Mitigation measures were were not made a condition of the approval of the project.
- 4) A mitigation reporting or monitoring plan was was not adopted for this project.
- 5) A Statement of Overriding Considerations was was not adopted for this project.
- 6) Findings were were not made pursuant to the provisions of CEQA.

The lead agency for the project, the Central Valley Flood Protection Board (CVFPB), certified the EIR and adopted a Mitigation Monitoring and Reporting Program (MMRP) and approved the project on June 9, 2016. The CVFPB then certified a Supplemental EIR, adopted an MMRP, and approved the Project on October 28, 2022. The California State Lands Commission has considered the EIRs as prepared for this project by CVFPB and adopted an independent Mitigation Monitoring Program incorporating CVFPB's documents. The EIR, Supplemental EIR, and the record of project approval may be examined at the California State Lands Commission office address.



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
