Project Description

On March 8, 2018, the San Francisco Planning Commission certified the Final Environmental Impact Report (FEIR) for the Biosolids Digester Facilities Project (Biosolids project or approved project) at the Southeast Water Pollution Control Plant (Southeast Plant), located in the southeast part of San Francisco. Originally built in 1952 with major upgrades in 1982 and 1996, the Southeast Plant is the City's largest wastewater treatment facility, treating approximately 80 percent of San Francisco's sewage and stormwater flows. The approved project includes the construction and operation of a new solids treatment process, odor control, energy recovery, and associated facilities to replace outdated existing facilities with more reliable, efficient, and modern technologies. Biosolids are the recyclable solid materials removed from the wastewater during the wastewater treatment process and digesters are the major facility used in the solids treatment process.

The SFPUC proposes to modify the approved project to construct an Operations, Engineering, and Maintenance building; a Mechanical Maintenance building; and a new utility enclosure at the Southeast Plant (the operations, engineering, and maintenance buildings instead of the originally approved Maintenance Shops 1 and 2. These proposed buildings would be located southeast of the originally approved location for the Maintenance Shops 1 and 2 and adjacent to, but outside of, the approved project site. The proposed buildings would support operations and maintenance activities and replace the current function of building SEP 850, and of the existing temporary pre-fabricated trailers (referred to as buildings "SEP 850A" and "SEP 850B"). The SFPUC would not demolish building SEP 870, which was originally proposed for demolition, and instead would demolish building SEP 850A and SEP 850B trailers, and the adjacent surface parking lot. Activities currently performed in the existing building SEP 850 and trailers would be temporarily relocated during construction. Temporary construction staging would occur along Jerrold Avenue and within the Southeast Plant.

The proposed operations, engineering and maintenance buildings would support operations and maintenance activities at the Southeast Plant, including the maintenance of treatment equipment, same as described for Maintenance Shops 1 and 2 under the approved project. The buildings would provide equipment repair areas, parts storage, and staff facilities. As with the approved project, the modified project would not result in changes to the overall treatment capacity of the Southeast Plant.

San Francisco Public Utilities Commission Approval Subject to Notice of Determination

The San Francisco Public Utilities Commission (SFPUC) approved the construction portion of the Construction Management/General Contractor (CM/GC) contract, number WW-750 with Clark Construction for the Operations, Engineering and Maintenance buildings by Resolution No. 25-0006 on January 14, 2025.

Determinations

The Biosolids Digester Facilities Project Final EIR was certified on March 8, 2018 and the first approval action took place on March 13, 2018 when the SFPUC approved the construction contract for the Biosolids project. The Planning Department issued Addendum 2 to the FEIR on December 20, 2024 for the proposed operations, engineering and maintenance building modifications to the Biosolids project. PROJECT DESCRIPTION:

The San Francisco Public Utilities Commission (SFPUC) proposes to construct new solids treatment, odor control, energy recovery, and associated facilities as part of improvements to the wastewater treatment facilities at the existing Southeast Water Pollution Control Plant (Southeast Plant or SEP) in San Francisco. The proposed project, the Biosolids Digester Facilities Project (BDFP or project), would replace the outdated existing solids treatment facilities with more reliable, efficient, and modern technologies and facilities. Biosolids are the recyclable solid materials removed from the wastewater during the treatment process, and digesters are the major facility used in the solids treatment process. Many of the existing SEP solids treatment facilities are over 60 years old, require significant maintenance, and are operating well beyond their useful life. The project would replace the existing digesters with new digesters and other new facilities that would produce higher-quality biosolids, capture and treat odors more effectively, and maximize digester gas utilization and energy recovery for the production of heat, steam, and electrical power. In addition, the project intends to locate the digesters farther away from existing residences, limit project-generated odors to the SEP fence line, and make visual improvements in and around the SEP.
