Project Title: May Water Diversion, Pond, Stream Restoration, and Stream Crossings Project (Lake or Streambed Alteration Agreement No.1600-2017-0662-R1)

Project Location (include county): The project to be completed is located within the Dean Creek and South Fork Eel River watershed, approximately 4.5 miles east of the town of Garberville, County of Humboldt, State of California. The project is located in Section 10, T4S, R4E, Humboldt Base and Meridian; in the Fort Seward U.S. Geological Survey 7.5minute quadrangle; Assessor's Parcel Number 223-111-004; latitude 40.1290 N and longitude -123.7155 W at the Parcel Centroid.

Project Description: The project is limited to eight (8) encroachments. One encroachment is for water diversion from an unnamed tributary to Dean Creek. Water is diverted for domestic use. Work for the water diversion will include facility retrofit, use, and maintenance of the water diversion infrastructure. Seven additional encroachments are proposed to improve flow conveyance, remove infrastructure from stream areas, and minimize erosion. Two road/stream crossings will be armored with appropriately sized rock at the outflow to minimize erosion. Two projects will redirect diverted flow more directly into existing stream channels. Three projects will remove infrastructure and debris from stream riparian areas. All projects shall incorporate erosion control best management practices (BMP's). All refuse placed in or where it may pass into a stream, including but not limited to tires and polypipe, shall be removed and disposed of at a designated waste management facility.
